I will list homework assignments in the Teaching Schedule document. You will see the type of work your child should do at home in the column to the right of the column that indicates what online classes they are in.

Any piece of homework can be turned in at anytime by making an image of the work and texting or emailing it to me for review, comments, and to determine if it meets the standard for your child to move on to the next online reading or math group or to the next level in any other particular subject.

I will issue a grade on homework on the first day of each week. The grade will be based on the amount of homework turned in relative to the amount issued, not on if the homework meets the standard for your child to move to the next online reading or math group or to the next level in any other particular subject.

TYPES OF HOMEWORK

Reading -

- Students should spend at least 10 minutes reading to or with their parents each school day.
- Parents simply need to text or email me that the student has been reading at least 10 minutes each day to satisfy this homework requirement.

Math -

- Students should practice the math concept that they were working on in their Zoom class each day.
- The amount of practice the student participates in is up to the parent or guardian.

- To satisfy the math homework assignment parents should text or email the work. If the work is oral, such as counting to 100, a video can be made or the parent can simply text or email me that their child met the requirement.
- Handwriting -
- Students will have a letter to practice writing each day.
- To be marked proficient in writing that letter the student needs to properly write the letter 10 times.
- I teach the students to write using the D'Nealian method. A sample of the D'Nealian method was sent to you previously and can be found [here](#). Or copy the URL into your browser. http://www.instructordave.org/uploads/1/2/6/1/12616182/dnealian_manuscript.pdf
- Students can move through the letters that they need to work at an accelerated pace if they choose to do so. - Parents should text or email the handwriting to me.

Writing -

- Students will have some writing to practice most school days.
- The assignments will consist of writing a sentence or two on a particular prompt, illustrating the sentence, and writing their name.
- Parents can text or email the writing work to me.
- The goal for the sentence writing homework is for the child to have an idea and represent that idea on paper.
- Focus on getting the idea on the paper
- Don't worry about spelling. Let your child spell the word any way they want based on their phonics knowledge.
- Don't worry about handwriting. Let your child write letters the best way they can.
- Work on leaving margins on both sides of the paper
- Work on leaving spaces between words
- If you want to do a second draft here is what to work on;
 - Spelling
 - Handwriting
 - Punctuation
 - Capitalization
 - Grammar
 - Add another sentence(s) to add more information
